From the Desk of Pastor Couradt

So Many Things

We are back in the swing of the school year. Sunday study (Didache) and Sunday school (Old Testament) have started back up. Youth Catechesis has begun Wednesday nights where we are spending the year studying the New Testament. Senior Group has begun on 2nd & 4th Mondays. We are studying the Minor Prophets. Adult Catechesis on Tuesday nights has finished a study of the Old Testament this summer and has been working through the New Testament. Later we will move on to Lutheran Catechesis. Preschool has started back up. On Tuesdays we spend time learning a Bible story in chapel and on Thursdays we spend time learning in the class room (we will soon begin working on the 10 Commandments).

Fall Fair Turkey Dinner will soon be upon us. Once again it will be drive thru only, but we hope that in the future we will have enough volunteers to get back to a sit down meal as well.

New this year I am holding a Men's Retreat. My desire in this is to draw us closer together. That, in accord with Titus 2, our old men and our young men (and every man in between) learn with each other and grow in the faith.

Our culture is moving at such a rapid pace away from God but we cannot go with it. To do this we need to rely on Him and build community.

The world and its prince (the devil) have ramped up their attack on

our children and grandchildren trying to lure them away from the only hope of salvation and we need to be prepared. We need a steady diet of His Word and the Sacrament. He has not left us alone.

In that vein, after years of study and conversation, as mentioned in the past, we have been equipping parents (especially fathers in accord with the scriptures and the catechism) to teach the faith in the home in addition to here at church. We are desiring to give them a deeper foundation and keep them in the faith. Soon, (in accordance with the scriptures and Lutheran Confessions), after examination and absolution, children who confess this faith and desire to receive the gift of our Lord's Supper, will receive communion for the first time. They will also continue their studies of the faith.

On the day that we observe Reformation (Oct 30th this year: wear red) a new crop of 3rd graders will receive the gift of God's Word presented by our church.

Later that day we will gather for our annual joint Reformation Vespers Service at St. John, Racine. Pastor Fabrizius, recently retired from Our Father's, Greenfield will be preaching.

We continue to have a monthly family get together here at church for movie night. Let's grow together!





"We Are All Beggars"

In the early morning hours of Feb. 18, 1546, Martin Luther closed his eyes forever. Before that happened, the hand that hammered the 95 Theses into the door of the Castle Church in Wittenberg on Oct. 31, 1517, penned its final words: "We are all beggars. This is true." And this is the truth that our Lord says makes you free.

Ironic, isn't it? In order to be free, you must be a beggar. You must be utterly dependent and reliant upon God. This makes us uncomfortable — the way we're uncomfortable when someone gets us a Christmas present when we haven't gotten them one. We feel we owe them. And we don't like being in someone's debt like that.

But what Luther would remind us is that we are all indeed beggars. And we're not just anyone's beggars. We're God's beggars. Christ came for sinners. He came to seek and save the lost. He came to heal the sick and raise the dead. He came for sinners, and He dwells only with sinners.

If we are to be where He is, we must be willing to be counted among the lost, the sick, and the dead. We must be willing to be beggars. We must cry out for mercy, for grace, and for his undeserved love and kindness. We must be dependent solely on Him and what He gives.


And here's the beauty: He gives us everything. Everything. Forgiveness of sins, salvation from death and the devil, and eternal life. This isn't because of any worthiness or merit in us. It is because of His divine goodness, mercy, and grace. On account of Christ's death and resurrection, the Father forgives you, saves you, and is pleased with you. You receive His love, His righteousness, His holiness, His acceptance, and His inheritance. We are all beggars. This is true.

This is the heart and soul of Christianity and the lifeblood of the Christian Church. God justifies us and declares us innocent and righteous by His grace received through faith for the sake of Christ. This isn't because of our works but because of His work on the cross. We, who once were enemies of God, are reconciled to Him and made to be His children.

This is what Luther pointed us to when He took up his pen for the last time and scribbled "We are all beggars. This is true." We are beggars, but we are beggars of the God who does not ignore us and who doesn't pass by us on the other side. We are beggars of the One who descended from heaven to make His dwelling with sinners.

We are beggars of Him who deigns to dwell with us, among us, and – yes – still in us by grace for Christ's sake. For in the bread and cup that we bless we share together with Christ and each other the riches of God's grace. The riches of this grace – the Gospel in sermon and absolution, in Baptism, and in Holy Communion – are so inexhaustible that our cups overflow. We, who are God's beggars, are inexhaustibly satisfied, and we have something to give back in thanksgiving and praise.



- · Proclaim His message to the nations.


Convention Logo Explanation




