### **Looking forward to the Eighteenth Sunday after Trinity**

Monday: Deuteronomy 10:12-21

Tuesday: I Corinthians 1:1-9

Wednesday: Matthew 22:34-46

Thursday: The Pharisees ask a Law question. Jesus asks a Gospel question. The Pharisees seek to trap Jesus in His own words. Jesus seeks to "trap" them in the saving reality of who He is as the Messiah (Matt 22:34-46). The Law requires you to "fear the Lord your God, to walk in all His ways, to serve Him with all your heart and with all your soul" and to "love the stranger" (Deut 10:12-21). Failure to keep the Law perfectly brings judgment. On the other hand, the Gospel brings the grace of God given by Jesus Christ, that you may be blameless in the day of His return (1 Cor 1:1-9). Jesus is David's Son yet David's Lord, true God and true man. He is Love incarnate who fulfilled all the demands of God's Law on our behalf, that we might be saved from the Law's condemnation and sanctified in the Gospel's forgiveness. Thereby we see that "God is faithful, by whom you were called into the fellowship of His Son, Jesus Christ our Lord."

### **Catechism for the Week: Third and Fourth Commandments**

*What is the Third Commandment?* Remember the Sabbath day by keeping it holy.

*What does this mean?* We should fear and love God so that we do not despise preaching and His Word, but hold it sacred and gladly hear and learn it.

*What is the Fourth Commandment?* Honor your father and your mother.

*What does this mean?* We should fear and love God so that we do not despise or anger our parents and other authorities, but honor them, serve and obey them, love and cherish them.

### **Prayers:**

#### **Collect of the Week (from Lutheran Prayer Companion)**

O Lord God, heavenly Father, we are poor, miserable sinners. We know Your will, but we are too weak to fulfill it. Flesh and blood are too strong in us, and the wicked adversary, the devil, leaves us no peace. Wherefore we beseech You, pour out Your Holy Spirit into our hearts, that we may cling to Your Son, Jesus Christ, with a firm faith, take comfort in His death and Passion, and believe that by Him we have complete forgiveness of all our sins, and so lead a holy life in Your will and obedience here on earth, and die a blessed death in Your grace; through Jesus Christ. Amen.
