From the Desk of Pastor Conradt

2023 Synodical Convention

I had the privilege to attend as a voting delegate the 68th Synodical Convention of The Lutheran Church-Missouri Synod which was held in Milwaukee, WI from Saturday July 29-Thursday August 3. Opening Divine Service began at 7:30pm Saturday, following the Common Service and was held reverently with multiple churchly instruments assisting and a number of pastors and district presidents assisting with distribution of our Lord's body and blood. Stations were set up with one pastor distributing the host, one pastor distributing the blood of Christ from the chalice, and the third overseeing with the cruet.

Official business should have begun after all had opportunity to worship together at local parishes on Sunday morning, but began at 8:30 am. Convention was often quickly paced in order to get through the business that was necessary, which did not always give ample time, but was required in many instances.

Main take aways:

We have broken fellowship with the Japanese Lutheran Church (a church which our missionaries help found) over authority of Scripture especially leading them to "ordain" women. "ordaining" women is not the source of the division it is one of the most blatant side effects of denying the total authority of the Bible as God's Word. However, official pulpit and altar fellowship was entered with five Church bodies throughout the world, including Sudan/South Sudan, Uganda, Finland, Sri Lanka, and Ukraine. We give thanks to God for their fidelity to the Scriptures and the Lutheran Confessions and pray for the schisms to cease.

We have seen turmoil throughout higher education and OUR Concordias have seen it as well. There was a drift away from the purpose of raising up

church workers toward the secular and in some cases identity has been lost. Since 2018, Concordia Selma, Concordia Portland, and Concordia Bronxville have closed. Prior to this Concordia Ann Arbor was somewhat absorbed by Concordia Mequon in order to stay open. Last year Concordia Austin's (CTX) Board of Directors voted to secede from the Synod and make the university their own. This was not a unanimous decision and caused some of the regents to resign. The Concordias though belong not to themselves, but to the Synod. They are OUR schools, Synod in convention called the university to repent and return what was stolen. Some new regents were voted on. The ball is now in CTX's court, and we pray that they repent, return, and are forgiven. Since then CTX has declared they will not allow these rightly elected regents to join.

Much discussion was had on teacher and pastor shortages. "The harvest truly is plentiful, but the laborers few. Therefore pray the Lord of the harvest to send out laborers into His harvest" (Matthew 9:37-38 NKJV). There was discussion about the routes that lead to ordination and residential, Master of Divinity (M. Div.) track is to be encouraged above all as the preferred model for a number of reasons.

We gave thanks to God for the overturning of Roe v. Wade and remain committed to defending life, from pre-born until natural death according to God's holy will. We reaffirmed that we must gather in person to receive Christ's gifts with our brothers and sisters in Christ and that we practice Closed Communion (Close Communion is synonymous).

It is evident that there is more work to be done to bring unity, but for the most part much of Synod is committed to the Scriptures and Lutheran Confessions.

ORGANIST NOTES by Daniel Grosskreuz

I am starting this new column with the goal of sharing some more information about various musical topics, but more importantly, to teach a little bit about the hymns, especially the Hymns of the Month. The next two Hymns of the Month, for October and November, are LSB 582, "God's Word is Our Great Heritage", and LSB 790, "Praise to the Lord the Almighty", respectively.

October's Hymn of the Month is "God's Word is Our Great Heritage". This hymn was written by Nikolai Fredrik Severin Grundtvig, who lived from 1783-1872. Grundtvig grew up in Denmark, in a time that was severely influenced by rationalism. The son of an orthodox Lutheran pastor, Grundtvig came to a more traditional form of Christianity, much like his father, through his studies. Unlike his rationalist contemporaries, Grundtvig held the scriptures in high esteem, inspiring him to write this hymn.

Grundtvig originally wrote 5 stanzas to this hymn. His first four stanzas make clear allusions to scripture, such as "Casting all your anxieties on Him, because He cares for you", in stanza 3, which references 1 Peter 5:7 which says, "casting all your care upon Him, for He cares for you." (NKJV). His fifth and final stanza is the hymn we have in our Lutheran Service Book. Often used for festive occasions and around Reformation Day, this final stanza is a testimony to the high place Grundtvig held scripture. We, as Lutherans, must be careful to always do the same.

November's Hymn of the Month is "Praise to the Lord, the Almighty". The author, Joachim Neander, was born in Bremen, Germany, around 1650. His greatgrandfather had actually been recommended to become a pastor by the early Lutheran Philipp Melancthon. Neander died tragically from tuberculosis at the young age of 30, but not before writing approximately 60 different hymns. While this hymn may be of good value in our hymnal, Neander was actually more well known as a German Pietist, and unfortunately, most of his hymns reflect that. Most of his hymns place the individual's spirituality, faith, and devotion as the subject of the text, rather than the work Christ has done for us and the forgiveness of our sin. This is why we only find one of Neander's hymns in the LSB. A final fun fact about Neander is that he would often spend time wandering a valley near Dusseldorf, Germany, composing hymns or poetry, and sometimes holding services. This valley was later renamed "Neanderthal", which means "Neander Valley" in German. This valley became famous in 1856 when the remains of the alleged Homo Neanderthalensis, or, The Neanderthal, were found there.

This hymn is, in particular, closely related to Psalms 146 and 150, which both center around the theme of Praise the Lord. Relating to Neander's background, this hymn can be found in almost any Protestant hymnal and is well known by most protestants. Finally, like Martin Luther often did, Neander embeds an "Amen" in the final stanza of this hymn. The original German has it as the final word, but unfortunately due to translation, it gets replaced to the third phrase.

Ladies Aid - LWML

LWML - Lutheran Women's Missionary League - Women in Missiom - Mission Minded Women - Women on a Mission - all of these titles and tag-lines make our focus very clear. We are a LCMS organization with a heart for missions to ensure that all people in the world hear and have access to the Good News of the Gospel.

The 40th Biennial LWML Convention held this year in Milwaukee is over. Over 3,500 people came to the convention. The Lutheran Women in Mission voting body adopted a \$2,350,000 mission goal for the 2023 - 2025 biennium. This goal by the grace of God will fund 31 missions grants.

The South Wisconsin District has two grants left for their 2022 - 2024 biennial mission goal. Grant #10 Doxology - \$8,000 - Care for clergy wives. A pilot program for 50 SWD clergy wives to be given tools to understand compassion fatigue on their husbands and families and how to establish healthy boundaries. Pick up a Mite box in the narthex.




