From the Desk of Pastor Couradt

Put the Best Construction on Everything

"Thou shalt not bear false witness against Thy neighbor" (Exodus 20:16). In the newer translation of Luther's Small Catechism we read, "The Eighth Commandment: You shall not give false testimony against your neighbor. What does this mean? We should fear and love God so that we do not tell lies about our neighbor, betray him, slander him, or hurt his reputation, but defend him, speak well of him, and explain everything in the kindest way." Or as the older translation ends, "put the best construction on everything."

In the Large Catechism Luther expands on this as he writes, "This commandment forbids all sins of the tongue (James 3), by which we may injure or confront our neighbor. To bear false witness is nothing else than a work of the tongue. Now, God prohibits whatever is done with the tongue against a fellow man. This applies to false preachers with their doctrine and blasphemy... or by lying and speaking evil. Here belongs particularly the detestable, shameful vice of speaking behind a person's back and slandering, to which the devil spurs us on, and of which much could be said. For it is a common evil plague that everyone prefers hearing evil more than hearing good about his neighbor

"People are called slanderers who are not content with knowing a thing, but go on to assume jurisdiction. When they know about a slight offense committed by another person, they carry it into every corner. They are delighted and tickled that they can stir up another's displeasure, just as swine delight to roll themselves in the dirt and root in it with the snout" (LC I 263-268).

At the installation of a pastor, the District President-or one of his officersaddresses the congregation with these words, "Beloved in the Lord, Holy Scripture says, 'Obey your leaders and submit to their authority. They keep watch over you as men who must give an account. Obey them so that their work will be a joy, not a burden, for that would be of no advantage to you' (Hebrews 13:17). You have heard the solemn promise of him called to be your pastor. Will you receive him, show him that love, honor, and obedience in the Lord that you owe to the shepherd and teacher placed over you by your Lord Jesus Christ, and will you support him by your gifts and pray for him always that in his labors he may retain a cheerful spirit and that his ministry among you may be abundantly blessed? Will you honor and uphold your pastor as he serves Christ in all his God-pleasing responsibilities? Will you aid him as he cares for his family? Will you be diligent to 'put the best construction on everything,' recognizing that 'love covers a multitude of sins'?" The vow of the congregation is "We will. with the help of God." (Agenda, p. 180)

If one has a question or issue follow our Lord's words in Matthew 18:15-17 and go and speak to the person directly first. No matter what our vocations in life: husband, wife, parent, child, employer, worker, pastor, or layman, those words are helpful for all of us. Christians strive to work together. To build up rather than tear down. When there is confusion or misunderstanding, the best thing to do is ask the person directly. We strive to do this for the sake of Christ's church and one another.

The church ended 2023 Q1 (Jan-March) with a surplus of \$11,088. Offerings were 8% higher than in the same period last year.

We were blessed with a surplus in the first quarter. Large expenses like the roof replacement and dehumidification equipment for the Sunday School rooms have been funded from savings. These surpluses replenish the savings for future needs.

Have Lutheran women ever met in Milwaukee, Wisconsin, for an LWML Convention?

utheran Women in Mission gathered in Milwaukee in 1981 for the 19th Biennial LWML Convention on June 22–25 (the same dates as the 2023 LWML Convention), under the theme "Come to the Living Waters." LWML President Helen Gienapp led the convention of 6,597 attendees. A nautical décor was used, and 52 "Ports of Interest" were presented by various LWML groups in breakout sessions. This convention was the first to close with a "You Were There" slide presentation of convention events. A post-convention mission tour to the Orient was offered.

12 Milwaukee Trivia Facts

- Located on Lake Michigan, the second largest Great Lake, with 2,300 square miles of fresh water.
- Has a river walk that spans more than three miles along the Milwaukee River, the only river in the U.S. that allows pedestrians to walk over boat traffic.
- Largest city in Wisconsin and ranks #24 in the U.S.
- Home to over 150 state and county parks and about 1,400 acres of beaches.
- Nicknamed "Brew City" or "The City that Beer Built" because of its rich brewing history.
- Nicknamed "Cream City," referring to the light-colored bricks made from the local clay (rich in limestone and magnesium) that have been used to construct many of the city's homes and buildings.

- Birthplace of Harley-Davidson Motor Company (est. in 1903).
- Birthplace of the QWERTY keyboard (that led to the modern typewriter common to laptops and smartphones all over the world).
- Home of the Milwaukee Art Museum located on the shores of Lake Michigan, plus over 45 museums in downtown Milwaukee and surrounding counties.
- Home to the highest concentration of frozen custard shops in the world and often called the "frozen custard capital of the world."
- Friday Fish Fry has been a tradition in the city since Prohibition, when bars following the law needed to make money.
- German Fest serves 20,000 bratwursts and 15,000 pieces of strudel to hungry patrons each summer.


