Looking forward to Cantate

Monday: Isaiah 12:1-6 Tuesday: James 1:17-21 Wednesday: John 16:5-15

Thursday: Though Jesus has departed from us visibly to the right hand of the Father who sent Him, yet this is to our advantage. Catechism for the Week: Table of Duties: What the Hearers Owe Their Pastors Part I

things with his instructor. Do not be deceived: God cannot be mocked. A man reaps what he sows. For the Scripture says, "Do not muzzle the ox while it is treading out the grain," and "The worker deserves his wages." (I Timothy 5:17-18)
