

# From the Desk of Pastor Conradt "Service in the Park"

On October 19th at 1:30 pm we will be having a worship service (Vespers) at 10 Club Park. This does not replace any of our services. Please still come that morning as we will be having a guest preacher and Bible Study presenter from Luther Classical College, in Casper, WY.

We will be following the order of Vespers (*LSB* p. 229). This is the same service that we use on the Wednesday Midweek services for Advent and Lent.

I am excited about this for a few reasons. I love our worship services. I believe that they clearly confess who God is and what He has done/continues to do for His creation. When you look at our services, they are mostly God's Word set to music. This is true of both the Divine Service and our prayer offices (Matins and Vespers). Vespers quotes Psalms 51, 70, 86, and 119; also II Corinthians 13. Psalm 141:2 "Let my prayer rise before You as incense, and the lifting up of my hands as the evening sacrifice precedes the singing of Luke 1:46-55 (The Magnificat: Song of Mary).

I love worshipping within our Sanctuary here at St. Peter's with our church family. I love when people come here to see who we are and what we are about. But I also recognize that there are many people out there in our own communities that need Jesus, that don't even know we exist. Both our individual church and our Missouri Synod.

Often when people hear the name Lutheran, they think of the largest denomination that carries the name in our country "Evangelical Lutheran Church in America". This is tragic given what the ELCA believes, teaches, confesses, and practices. At their last Convention they shared a video that declared the following Scripture passages to be "harmful": Gen. 3:16, Judges 19, I

Corinthians 11:3-16, I Timothy 2:15, Exodus 20:17, Deuteronomy 21:11-14, Ephesians 5:22-24, I Timothy 2:9, I Corinthians 14:34-35, Colossians 3:18, Peter 3:1-6 [sic] (I assume they meant I Peter 3:1-6, and Titus 2:4-5. In the same video they claim, "A Lutheran reading-centered on Christ-frees us from taking all of these passages literally."

This is how many view the Lutheran Church. They don't know that we unwaveringly stand on God's unchanging Word and have not rejected the beautiful traditions of our forefathers.

St. Peter's is a thriving congregation made up of multiple generations. She is joy filled and hopeful as she awaits the coming Day of Resurrection. We have some of the richest hymnody dating back millennia that clearly confesses biblical truth. And these songs are on the lips of our most seasoned members and children.

This world and our communities include people broken by the devil, the world, and their own sinful flesh. They are shrouded in the darkness and they need the light of Christ. The light that shines through you.

Please join us Sunday morning for the chief Divine Service at 9:30am, and then again at 1:30pm at 10 Club Park on 1st and Main. We'll be under the tent. There will be tables, but also feel free to bring your own chairs if you want. Also bring a Lutheran Service Book. Full printed service bulletins will be available for those that don't have one and any visitors that may stop. Let the greater Waterford area know that Biblical and Traditional Christianity is still alive and well; even after 160 years.

We *are still enrolling* and have space to grow. Please encourage your family, friends, and neighbors to consider us.

*Preschool Playtime (Families with kids ages 2-5)* New time this fall - 10:15 - 11:15 a.m. on Thursdays (October 23, November 20, and December 11). Meet at the playground to start, then do some music with Mr. B and visit the classroom (with a snack). Invite your friends. I hope to see you there.

Luther Classical College is addressing the needs of a failing education system in our country and also helps families and churches flourish. The college...


- Immerses students in the Scriptures and the founding documents of the Lutheran Church.

- Takes no government money and so is fiercely independent and strong.


The college broke ground in June 2024 for the new campus on a beautiful tract of land at the foot of Casper Mountain in Wyoming.



# Ladies Aid/LWML - September Article from Lutheran Women's Quarterly.



"Listen to me, you who pursue righteousness, you who seek the Lord: look to the rock from which you were hewn, and to the quarry from which you were dug. Look at Abraham, your father, and to Sarah who bore you; for he was but one when I called him, that I might bless him and multiply him" (Isaiah 51:1-2).

n insurance company had the Rock of Gibraltar for its logo, encouraging the purchase of a "piece of the rock." The Rock is seen as sturdy and unmoving, not faltering with each passing storm, which is what the company wants you to believe it is.

Through His prophet, God was telling the people to look at the rock from which they were cut—the rock of faith and reliance on God. Abraham trusted God and God blessed him. The people of Israel were in captivity. God encouraged them to trust and rely on Him, to not lose heart because He was with them.

We, like the people in Isaiah's day, try to live right and follow the Lord, but because we are sinners, we neither live right nor follow the Lord on our own. That is why we need to look to the Rock — our Rock of Salvation, Jesus Christ, for strength and reassurance. Just as God was with the people of Israel during their captivity in Babylon, He is with each of us every hour of every day.

As I spent about three hours sitting in the emergency room with an adult son, listening to

him whine and complain, I began thinking about the many times that I do the same thing with God—trying to do everything on my own without looking to the Rock and trusting His guidance and wisdom. Then I complain and whine to Him when things don't work out the way I want. God is faithful and has promised to be with each of us always, even when things do not go my way.

Is it really that easy? Yes! The hard part is getting "me" out of the way. The faith that God has worked in my heart through Baptism, His Word, and His Holy Supper is sufficient. That is why we learned in Martin Luther's explanation of Baptism, that "the old Adam in us ... should be drowned by daily sorrow and repentance ... and that a new man should come forth daily ..." We must constantly look to the Rock.

Closing Prayer: Lord God, Heavenly Father, help us always to remember to look to You, our Rock, trusting Your promises that You will be with us always. Keep us focused to know our strength comes from You. All our petitions we bring in the name of Jesus, Amen.
