Looking forward to the Eighteenth Sunday after Trinity

Monday: Deuteronomy 10:12-21

Tuesday: I Corinthians 1:4-8

Wednesday: Matthew 22:34-46

Thursday: The Pharisees ask a Law question. Jesus asks a Gospel question. The Pharisees seek to trap Jesus in His own words. Jesus seeks to "trap" them in the saving reality of who He is as the Messiah (Matt 22:34-46). The Law requires you to "fear the Lord your God, to walk in all His ways, to serve Him with all your heart and with all your soul" and to "love the stranger" (Deut 10:12-21). Failure to keep the Law perfectly brings judgment. On the other hand, the Gospel brings the grace of God given by Jesus Christ, that you may be blameless in the day of His return (1 Cor 1:4-8). Jesus is David's Son yet David's Lord, true God and true man. He is Love incarnate who fulfilled all the demands of God's Law on our behalf, that we might be saved from the Law's condemnation and sanctified in the Gospel's forgiveness. Thereby we see that "God is faithful, by whom you were called into the fellowship of His Son, Jesus Christ our Lord."

Catechism for the Week: The Conclusion of the Commandments

Conclusion: What Does God Say of All These Commandments? He says: “For I, the Lord your God, am a jealous God, visiting the iniquity of the fathers upon the children to the third and fourth generations of those who hate Me, but showing mercy to thousands, to those who love Me and keep My commandments.” (Ex 20:5-6)

What does this mean? God threatens to punish all who sin against these commandments. Therefore, we should fear His wrath and not act contrary to these

commandments. But He promises grace and every blessing to all who keep these commandments. Therefore, we should also love and trust in Him, and gladly do what He commands.

Collect of the Week (from Lutheran Prayer Companion)

O Lord God, heavenly Father, we are poor, miserable sinners. We know Your will, but we are too weak to fulfill it. Flesh and blood are too strong in us, and the wicked adversary, the devil, leaves us no peace. Wherefore we beseech You, pour out Your Holy Spirit into our hearts, that we may cling to Your Son, Jesus Christ, with a firm faith, take comfort in His death and Passion, and believe that by Him we have complete forgiveness of all our sins, and so lead a holy life in Your will and obedience here on earth, and die a blessed death in Your grace; through Jesus Christ. Amen.
