From the Desk of Pastor Conradt

Memento: For the Christian Man

"Brothers, we live in a distracted age. Our culture is drowning in [addictions], consumerism, endless scrolling, and shallow entertainment. Men are losing the strength to lead, the courage to sacrifice, and the clarity to know what matters most. Families are fraying, churches are shrinking, and too many men are settling for comfort over calling. The enemy is pleased to see men passive, distracted, and asleep to their God-given responsibilities.

"But God has not called us to drift. Scripture is clear: "Train yourself for godliness; for while bodily training is of some value, godliness is of value in every way, as it holds promise for the present life and also for the life to come" (1 Tim. 4:7–8). Again, Paul exhorts, "Stand firm in the faith, act like men, be strong" (1 Cor. 16:13). And in Titus he commands, "Urge the young men to be self-controlled, showing yourself in all respects to be a model of good works" (Titus 2:6–7). A man without discipline is a man without freedom. A man without devotion is a man without strength. Discipline and devotion are not optional — they are the shape of a man's calling under Christ.

"The Church has always understood this. From the earliest Christians who fasted and prayed together, to faithful fathers who ordered their households by Scripture and worship, to generations who passed on the catechism to their children — God's people have always known that faith is not formed in moments of comfort, but through patterns of prayer, sacrifice, and brotherhood. These practices are not ways of earning God's favor — Christ has already secured that for us on the cross. Rather, they are the gifts God gives to strengthen us in Him. They train us to resist temptation, to crucify our sinful desires, and to live with joy, courage, and hope.

"That's why Memento exists. The very name means "remember." We remember our mortality — that our days are short and our strength is fleeting. We remember our sin — that apart from Christ we are helpless. We remember Christ's suffering — that He has borne the cross for us and calls us to follow Him. We remember the men who came before us — fathers, martyrs, saints — who faced the same struggles and endured in the faith. And we remember our calling — to stand

firm, to serve our families, to lead our churches, and to shape the future with courage and conviction.

"Memento isn't about adding one more program to your already crowded life. It is about reclaiming the ancient rhythm of fasting, prayer, Scripture, and brotherhood — not as empty rituals, but as life-giving habits rooted in Christ. Through these disciplines, men are set free from distractions and trained to live as God has called them: husbands who love their wives with faithfulness and strength, fathers who bless their children with wisdom and patience, leaders who strengthen their churches with courage and clarity, and brothers who lock arms together in the battle of faith.

"We believe the Church needs men who are awake. Men who resist the slavery of pornography, passivity, and endless distraction. Men who understand that true freedom does not come from indulging every appetite, but from learning to master them in Christ. Men who see their calling not only to survive in this world, but to live boldly for the sake of their families, their congregations, and the generations yet to come.

"This is why Memento is built not for a weekend, not for a quick burst of enthusiasm, but for a way of life. What begins in a 70-day Lenten fast continues throughout the year, following the rhythm of the Church: fasting and feasting, repentance and celebration, discipline and freedom. You are not left to figure it out alone. You are placed into a brotherhood where you will be encouraged, challenged, and supported. Together, you will discover that "for freedom Christ has set us free; stand firm therefore, and do not submit again to a yoke of slavery" (Gal. 5:1).

"This is not temporary inspiration. This is daily training in the way of Christ. This is discipline made daily, devotion made lasting, and brotherhood made strong.

"Let's remember. Let's rise. Let's reclaim the man."

On October 12th, 2025 Pastor Conradt started out the service by saying "I want you to take just a few seconds and think about what you did to prepare for service this morning?" This got me thinking. It's hard not to get involved in the conversations around you as you wait for the worship service to start. But what about those that physically and mentally prepare for God's word. Choosing what they will wear, praying or mediating on God's Word prior to service at home and while sitting quietly in the pew. Many folks look through the bulletin and prepare for the service by bookmarking the Order of Worship and all the hymns. It's certainly a blessing to have a church family. People we know or not, people with the same sense of values or not, trying to reflect on how their days were spent or how to spend the days ahead. Double Crumble Chocolate Bars

| ½ c. Butter | 1/4 tsp. Baking Powder |
|----------------|------------------------|
| ¾ c. Sugar | ½ c. Chopped Nuts |
| 2 Eggs | 2 c. Mini Marshmallows |
| 1 tsp. Vanilla | 1 c. Chocolate Chips |
| 3/4 c. Flour | 1 c. Peanut Butter |
| 2 T. Cocoa | ½ c. Rice Krispies |
| 1/4 t. Salt | · |

Cream together the butter, sugar, eggs, vanilla. Mix together the flour, cocoa, salt, baking powder and add to the creamed mixture. Add chopped nuts (optional). Bake for 15 to 20 minutes at 325 degrees in a greased pan. Spread the 2 cups marshmallows on top: put back in oven until melted, about 3 minutes. Mix together the chocolate chips and peanut butter and melt together. Once melted add Rice Krispies. Spread carefully on top of bars. Cool and cut into squares.

Why do you kick against the goads?

A goad is a sharp stick (aka pricks in KJV) used by a farmer to prod oxen into moving where the farmer wants them to, particularly when they are pulling a plow. The metaphorical meaning in light of Jesus speaking to Saul (soon Paul) on the road to Damascus was that Saul was resisting hearing God's message to him of salvation in Jesus Christ. (Acts 9:5) In our lives, God may use subtle or dramatic things to bring us back to His word and His will. When we kick against God's leading it often causes us more pain and suffering on account of our own sinfulness and self centeredness. God calls us all to repent this Advent season and receive the Christ child given FOR YOU on Christmas and for the saving of the world. The words of the wise are like goads, and the words of scholars are like well-driven nails, given by one Shepherd. Ecclesiastes 12:11

Thank you to all who have filled out a Congregational Survey. We are nearing our goal number! Thank you to all who are taking flyers and Community surveys out to your friends, neighbors, and co-workers and asking them to give us a sense of the beat of the people in our midst about a Lutheran Classical School. **We still need more surveys! Please continue to share the link and flyers!** The Genesis Project Steering Committee met and discussed the action plan steps for the next year and began discussing what they have heard about ideas for Lutheran schooling based in and around St. Peter's. Ideas include a Lutheran Classical School, a Homeschool Hybrid, or No School but focused activities / opportunities for enrichment for families with children. The next phases: Survey Completion, Consultation (happening January 16 & 17), Option exploration, Gauging and Growing Support and Voting, Implementation of some type of action based on congregational will and decisions.

Of note, the CCLE (Consortium for Classical Lutheran Education) has job postings for a Homeschool Hybrid at All Saints Lutheran Church in Charlotte, NC where "students attend school on Monday and Wednesday at the church and are homeschooled the other days of the week in accord with the designated and assigned curriculum." Additionally here in Wausau, WI, at Zion Lutheran, the congregation is organizing Lutheran Classical Academy of St. David the King for next year.

Some have asked, "How is this any different from what we tried before recently?" To this the answer is "everything and nothing at all." Everything is different because the composition of

Living by the exceedingly great and precious promises of God - 1 Peter 1:4

St. Peter's is different (new families, another generation, different political and technological world). On the other hand, nothing has changed - God hasn't changed His love for us (Malachi 3:6). Sinners haven't been perfected outside of God's declared righteousness and means through His word in with and under water, bread, and wine. Pedagogically, the school concept is very different. Classical entails a different style of learning and curriculum, and the catechetical focus intertwines the school with the life of the church in its yearly pattern of stories and songs. The reality of economics was recently commented upon in a conversation I was having with a marketing partner. This person said, "With a reasonably obtainable tuition of \$2000 a child and about 10 children, and congregational support and other grants / funds for the other \$60 - 80K, a school can have a good start and grow. It will come down to the will of the congregation if this can move forward." My job here is to ask questions and see if there is support for a variety of ideas, as well as help facilitate discussion on what is needed, desired, and feasible in this congregation, facility, and community. Please remember that God IS doing something in our midst! He does will that the congregation comes together and finds solutions for the needs of its members, and that could be in a variety of ways. May we not "kick against the goads" and cause more pain for ourselves, but rather talk peacefully and share ideas of what may work for those with children in our midst. Thank you for your participation in these discussions and your prayers and support!
