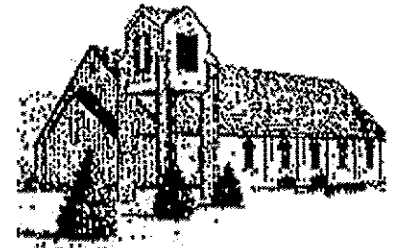

From the Desk of Pastor Conradt "Advice from 1966"

As Kathy and I were looking on top of some shelves recently, we came across cases that we didn't know much about. After pulling them down and looking at them, we found a video camcorder (records on VHS tape) and a box marked "Cemetery".

Thankfully, George is a treasure. The next week Amy figured out which key opened the "Cemetery" box and George found a document titled "Highlights: Lutheran High School". It was dated May, 1966.

Included in that box was Racine Lutheran High's newsletter from that month/year. They were alerting the public that tuition rates were going to have to be raised. Members of a Missouri Synod Association Church would change from \$165 to \$190 and non-members would change from \$350 to \$375. My, how times have changed.

But more importantly than this, there was an article titled: *1500 Year Old Advice Is Still Good*. I share it with you in full.

"John Chrysostom, born 347 A.D., died 407 A.D., one of four Greek Christian Church Fathers, is recorded as once saying —

'Parents ought to give their children a name having a Christian significance, in order that it may subsequently be a source of good influence.... Mothers ought to care for the bodies of their children, but it is necessary also, that they inspire their offspring with love for the good

and with fear toward God. And fathers will not limit themselves to giving their children an earthly vocation, but will interest themselves, also in their heavenly calling.

'The most beautiful heritage that can be given children is to teach them to govern their passions. Never ought they to hear licentious conversation at home. Let us take care to develop modesty in them, for nothing torments youth so much as what is contrary thereto,

'Let us have for our children the same fear that we have for our houses, when servants go with a light into places where there is inflammable material, as hay or straw. They should not be permitted to go where the fire of impurity may be kindled in their hearts and so do them an irreparable injury.

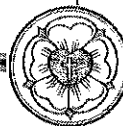
'A knowledge of the Scriptures is an antidote against the unreasonable inclinations of youth and against the reading of pagan authors, in which heroes, the slaves of every passion, are lauded. The lessons of the Bible are springs that water the soul."

St. John Chrysostom is called Chrysostom (*i.e.* golden mouth) for a reason. His wisdom and advice from, now, 1600 years ago is just as true in our day as it was in his. May parents use every opportunity to invest primarily in their children's eternal vocation and then secondarily earthly. And may the church assist them in this duty. To God's glory.

GENESIS PROJECT UPDATE

The committee received a report from the LCMS School Ministry based on the recent consultants' visits. We also have reviewed the School Determination Survey results (40 so far). **You are still welcome to turn in your survey (online or paper to the office).** The Steering committee will give a summary update at the May Voters' meeting (May 17th) and provide recommendations for actions moving forward.

RECIPE

Cheese Rangoons with Sweet Ginger Chili Sauce

20 mins prep, 15 mins cook, 35 mins total

Easy to make, crisp on the outside, creamy inside, and served with a completely addicting chili sauce!

- 8 oz cream cheese, at room temperature
- 3 green onions, finely chopped
- ½ tsp garlic powder
- 2 tsp tamari or soy sauce
- 20 square wonton wrappers
- toasted sesame oil, for brushing

Sweet Ginger Chili Sauce

- ⅓ cup honey
- 2 tbsp ketchup
- 1-2 tbsp chili sauce
- 2 tsp lime zest, plus 2 tablespoons lime juice
- 1 tbsp rice vinegar
- 2 tsp tamari or soy sauce
- 1 tbsp grated ginger
- 1 clove garlic, grated
- 2 tbsp chopped Thai basil or cilantro

1. Preheat the oven to 400° F. Line a baking sheet with parchment.
2. In a bowl, mix the cream cheese, green onions, garlic powder, and soy sauce.
3. To assemble, spoon 1 rounded teaspoon of filling onto each wrapper. Brush water around the edges of the wrapper, then bring the corners of the wrapper together in the center and pinch to seal the cream cheese inside. Place it on the prepared baking sheet. Brush each Rangoon with oil.
4. Bake for 12-15 minutes, until crispy. If the Rangoons are browning on top, cover with foil.
5. To make the sauce, combine all ingredients in a bowl.
6. Serve topped with green onions and dip in chili sauce.

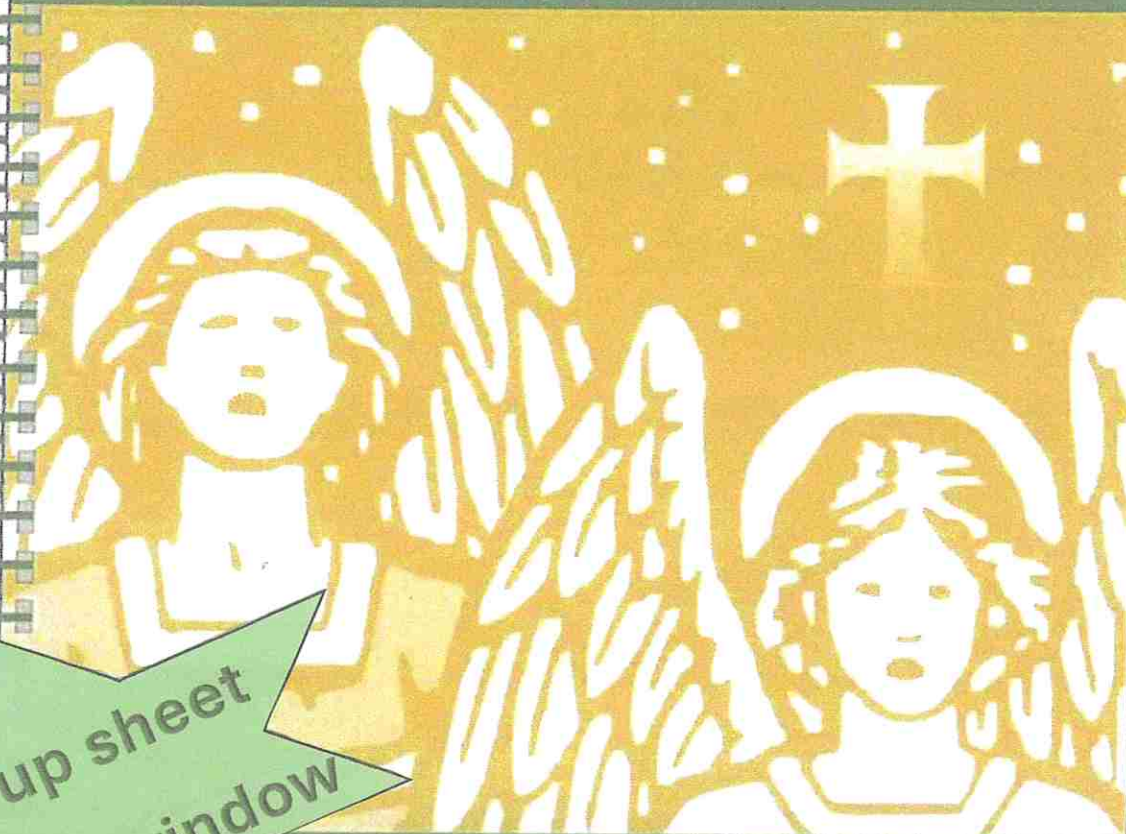

From the Director - Melvin Beversdorf



Therefore we were buried with Him through baptism into death, that just as Christ was raised from the dead by the glory of the Father, even so we also should walk in newness of life. Romans 6:4

Springtime reminds us of new birth. As I watch the mother duck in the courtyard with the children, I reflect on the gift of life and our dependence on God, our Creator. The struggle of this life is one that we have God's full and faithful support in. In our baptism we gain the life of Christ, even though we often fall and rise again. "Whoever believes in Me shall never die." John 11:26 As we are given the complete perfection of an eternal will in Christ, we pray God sends His Holy Spirit to guide and direct our daily lives as we struggle with the seed of the devil that is our flesh that bears sinful fruit. The seed of the woman promised in Genesis is the Word of God in the church and so we read daily and inwardly meditate and outward sing and say the words of God in our prayers, asking God to transform our lowly thoughts to His spiritual goodness. Alleluia! We celebrate the risen Christ in our daily lives!



Now if we died with Christ, we believe that we shall also live with Him, knowing that Christ, having been raised from the dead, dies no more. Death no longer has dominion over Him. 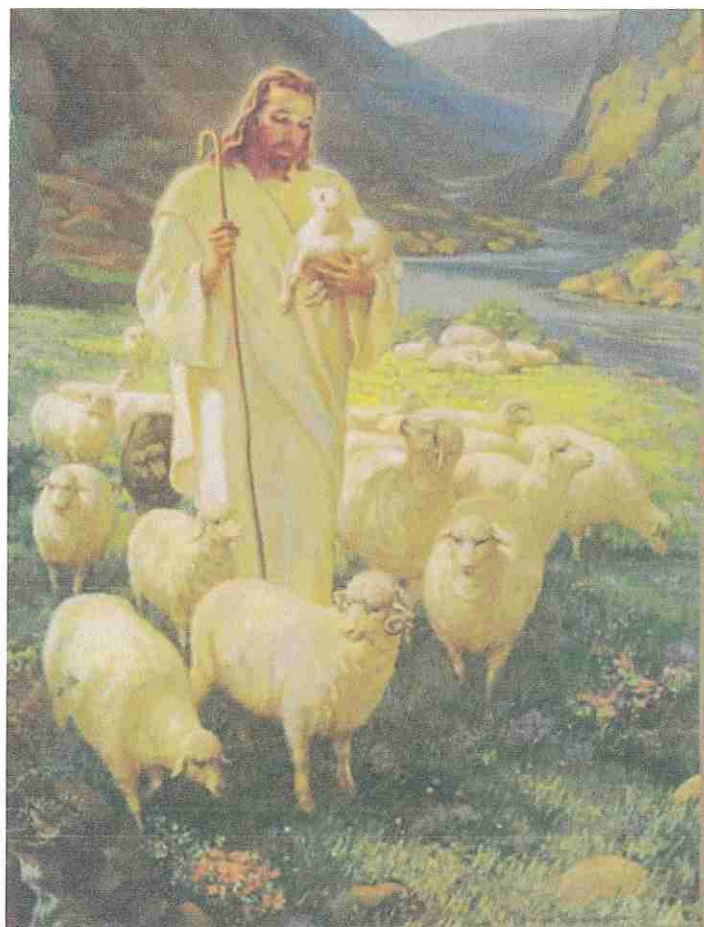

As your preschool director and classical school researcher, I'm blessed to travel to see many models of schools. I've visited: St. James the Less Classical Academy (Mukwonago), Chesterton Catholic Classical (9-12 Menomonee Falls), Luther Classical Academy (K-8 LCMS, Port Washington), Peace Catechetical Academy (K-8 LCMS, Sussex),

Immanuel Lutheran School (K-12 LCMS, Mayville), Aquinas Academy (K-8 Catholic, Menomonee Falls), Trinity Lutheran Classical High School (LCMS 9-12, Elm Grove), Emmanuel Lutheran School (K-8 LCMS, Dearborn, MI), Tall Oaks Academy (K-8 Reformed, Kenosha), Lake Country Classical (K-12 Hillsdale Charter model, Oconomowoc), Imago Dei Classical School (K-8 Baptist, Kenosha), Kenosha Christian Academy (K-8 Reformed, Kenosha), Doxa Christian Academy (K-8, New Berlin). In discussions with leaders and teachers at these 12 schools and the ongoing learning that I obtain from the CCLE, CUW, Hillsdale, and Herzog Foundation, I gather information to share ideas of what may work to educate the children of St. Peter's Lutheran (and the local community interested in Christian education). I am amazed at God at work with kids!

Genesis update - Preliminary results are in for the School Determination Survey (over 40 respondents - Thank you!). More details will be shared at the May 17 Congregational Voters' meeting. Due to staffing changes on the synod level the initial congregational and community surveys need more data input from our paper surveys for the full results. The Genesis Project consultants did share their final report and gave the recommendation of gathering support and considering a Fall 2027 launch to a Classical Academy, pending congregational support. This idea as well as how it can open up to the homeschool hybrid (a la carte classes for St. Peter's families) model will be shared. Additionally, the details on how enrichment classes and a homeschool co-operative concept works will be discussed. Please make sure to ask any of your questions of the Genesis Committee, the Board of Parish Education, and myself before or during the meeting. Thank you for your prayers during this process!



Preschool update - We are in the last 4 weeks of school (We run September through May.) Students are enjoying the ABC Countdown to Summer with special letter fun everyday. **Thank you for blessing us this year with your donations, prayers, and smiles to the children if you caught them walking in the halls.** It made for a very special and wonderful year!

Deaconess Kim Trombley with LWML President Eden Keefe. Deaconess Kim was installed as Executive Director of the LWML Office in January 2026.

Deaconess comes from the Greek word "diakonos" meaning servant.

Deaconesses have served the Lutheran church since the 1830s, but even many lifelong Lutherans are unsure exactly what these special women do. A deaconess shares the Gospel of Jesus Christ through a ministry of works of mercy, spiritual care, and teaching the Christian faith. She guides people toward the pastor who administers Word and Sacrament ministry. Saint Paul commends Phoebe in Romans 16. As a helper to Paul and many others, she is often considered the first deaconess.

Deaconesses serve through acts of mercy. They serve where there is shame, hurt, pain, injustice, violence, and abuse. A deaconess reminds those suffering, of their Baptism — that they have been cleansed at the altar. She applies properly distinguished Law and Gospel, to point them back to the source of life in Jesus Christ. She persistently points the sufferers to make confession to the pastor to receive holy absolution, which is the Gospel. She teaches God's Word to prepare people for the difficulties Christians experience in life and to make ready their souls for eternal life in Christ.

Deaconesses serve within the parishes, institutions, and missions of The Lutheran Church—Missouri Synod. Such service includes acts of mercy, spiritual care, and teaching the faith.

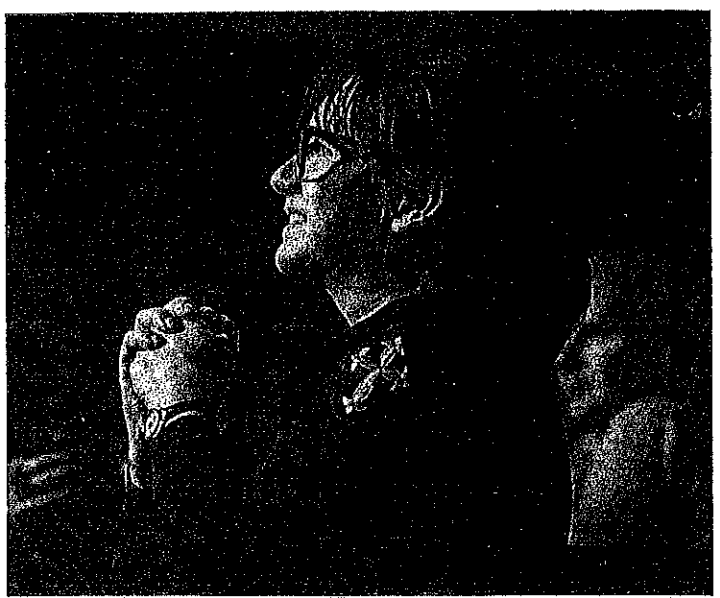

But He will not let me perish!

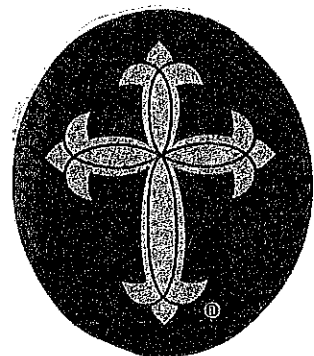
And if I grow old in this service?
