From the Desk of Pastor Conradt

America at 250

On July 4, A+D 1776, the Second Continental Congress ratified *The Unanimous Declaration of the thirteen united States of America*. Written primarily by Thomas Jefferson the authors also included John Adams, Benjamin Franklin, Robert R. Livingston, and Roger Sherman.

While not all of them were orthodox Christians, they were formed by Christendom and recognize "the laws of nature and of nature's God..." and "We hold these truths to be self-evident: That all men are created equal: that they are endowed by their Creator with certain unalienable rights: that among these are life, liberty, and the pursuit of happiness..." and "appealing to the Supreme Judge of the world..." and finally "with a firm reliance on the protection of Divine Providence". (Declaration)

The majority of the founding fathers were Christian and nearly half were trained as ministers. John Adams co-wrote the State Constitution of Massachusetts reading in 1780, "As the happiness of a people, and the good order and preservation of civil government, essentially depend upon piety, religion and morality; and as these cannot be generally diffused through a community, but by the institution of the public worship of God, and of public instructions in piety, religion and morality: Therefore, to promote their happiness and to secure the good order and preservation of their government, the people of this commonwealth have a right to invest their legislature with power to authorize and require, and the legislature shall, from time to time, authorize and require, the several towns, parishes, precincts, and other bod-

ies politic, or religious societies, to make suitable provision, at their own expense, for the institution of the public worship of God, and for the support and maintenance of public Protestant teachers of piety, religion and morality, in all cases where such provision shall not be made voluntarily."

Nine of the original State Constitutions required active membership in a Christian church in order for men to hold political offices. Delaware required this oath, "I, do profess faith in God the Father, and in Jesus Christ His only Son, and in the Holy Ghost, one God, blessed for evermore; and I do acknowledge the holy scriptures of the Old and New Testament to be given by divine inspiration." The list goes on and on.

The Psalmist is clear, "Blessed is the nation whose God is the LORD (YHWH)" (Psalm 33:12). America was founded as an extension of Christendom. She thrived and was blessed. May her people repent and return to it. May the legal child sacrifice cease. May the protected perversities cease. May the promotion of blasphemers cease. May she recognize once again God's providence and remember the words, "If My people, who are called by My name, shall humble themselves and pray, and seek My face and turn from their wicked ways, then will I hear from heaven, and will forgive their sin and will heal their land" (II Chronicles 7:14).

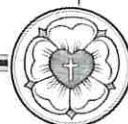
May we do this that, if the Lord wills, there will be more years for our descendants to reap the benefits that we have received.

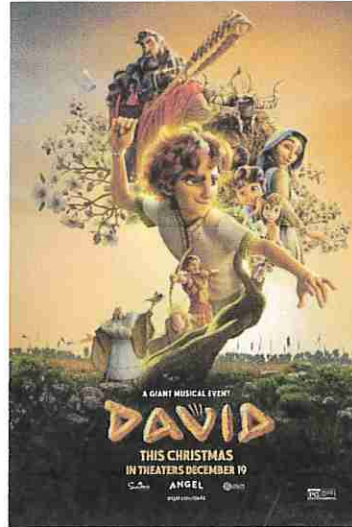

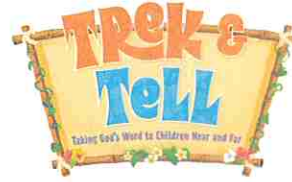

LIONS CLUB EYEGLOSS AND HEARING AID COLLECTION

The Wisconsin Lions Club recycling center, located in Rosholt, WI, is one of only 18 Lions Clubs International Certified Recycling Centers in the world. Annually, 800,000 to 1,000,000+ pairs of used eyeglasses are processed at the recycling center to be sent on Missions to developing countries across the globe.

Hearing aids collected are offered to Wisconsinites who cannot afford to purchase them on their own and who do not qualify for state-funded assistance.

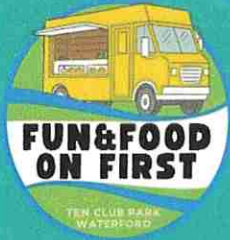

St. Peter's Lutheran Preschool & Genesis Project Final Update

From the Director - Melvin Beversdorf



"For I am the LORD, I do not change;

Therefore you are not consumed, O sons of Jacob. Malachi 3:6

*Before the mountains were brought forth, or ever You had formed the earth and the world,
Even from everlasting to everlasting, You are God. Psalm 90:2*

Well, things are changing. As they always do, but our God does not change. This means that His love for us is eternal. It was from the very instant He first thought of this world, of each flower, of each insect, of each of you. His desire to have a deep and lasting relationship has always been there. That's why the Trinity is mentioned in Genesis 1. God's nature is love and mercy. That's why Jesus came to die in the flesh, and was raised in the flesh, and Job proclaims, "For I know that my Redeemer lives, And He shall stand at last on the earth; And after my skin is destroyed, this I know, **That in my flesh I shall see God, Whom I shall see for myself, And my eyes shall behold, and not another. How my heart years within me!**" (Job 19) As we transition from Easter to Ascension to Pentecost to the season of Trinity, we yearn to know God. We teach our children

about the surety of our faith. We are redeemed, forgiven, we do live forever. By faith now, but by the eternal promises of God forever.

Genesis Project (Classical School Feasibility & Readiness) Update: The congregational voters passed the resolution on May 18, 2025 to support the Genesis Project. What does that mean? The Pastor, Church Chairman, and the District Education Executive filled out initial School Readiness surveys. The Board of Parish Ed completed the application and explained the primary reasons that are motivating them to consider starting a classical school. The church sent in the \$500 application fee to LCMS School Ministry. Then the application was reviewed, consultants were assigned, and we began the process. We had 59 Congregational Surveys completed. We had 43 Community / Potential Parent surveys completed. Two LCMS Consultants visited on January 23 & 24, 2016 and discussed with the congregation and community members who attended (24 in all) about the motivation, feasibility, and readiness for a Lutheran Classical Academy at St. Peter's. The Steering committee met monthly to discuss and facilitate steps in this process.

The results were favorable. The consultants recommended securing congregational support and community interest. This means that the congregation would need to commit to sponsoring the 3-5 year set up of a Lutheran Classical Academy at St. Peter's (K-8 or K-12). This could include needed updates to the facility in preparations of such a school.

Many ideas were discussed during the meetings. Ideas for a homeschool cooperative (where parents lead "classes" with students - often once a week for 6-10 week sessions, 2 or 3 times a year), enrichment classes (such as Latin, Science, Geography, Literature, History, etc.), and hybrid (a la carte classes at the school) education. **In the end, the Steering Committee concluded that YES it is feasible to have a school, but NO, St. Peter's is not ready to support it yet.** While it would be the ONLY K-8 or K-12 Christian School in Waterford (which could be a huge advantage), it is not clear HOW MANY church and community members would want to be a part of a classical academy. While that is being determined the Board of Parish Education would like to encourage the organization of the Homeschool Co-op and offer facilities as appropriate for their needs. Enrichment classes (Latin with Pastor) will begin at the end of May. More enrichment opportunities will be considered for the Fall. Between January to

April 2027, the Board of Parish Education will reevaluate the needs of the church and consider more community conversations to see if there is enough interest and congregational support to consider a Fall 2028 Lutheran Classical Academy.

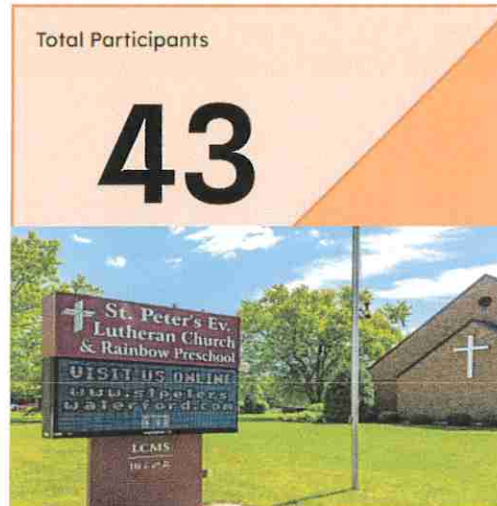

Steering Committee's Conclusion:

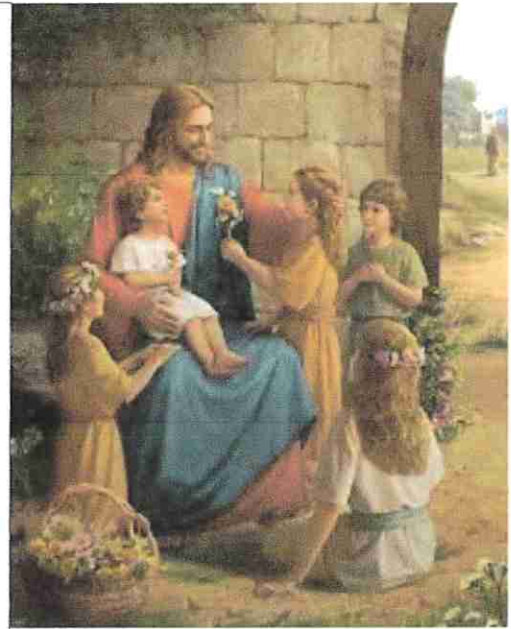
It's in our DNA to educate children, especially the children in the church. St. Peter's built a school 160 years ago.

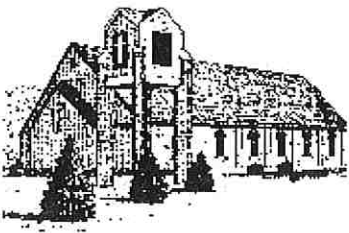

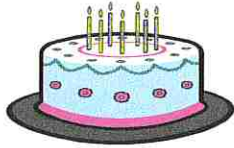

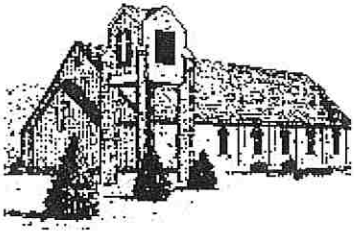
